WILLIAM ROBERT PLUMLEE
 INFORMATION CONCERNING

On June 30, 1976, William Robert Plumlee telephoned the Phoenix Division of the FBI, asked to speak to a Special Agent, and stated that he was calling in an effort to determine why the FBI was trying to contact him. Plumlee was told that the FBI had not attempted to contact him. Plumlee then stated that Paul Dean, a journalist for the "Arizona Republic" newspaper, also had left a note for him to call, but when he contacted the paper, Dean also denied trying to contact him.

On July 1, 1976, Plumlee again telephoned the Phoenix Division and stated that he had checked around and determined that perhaps the FBI had been trying to contact him because he was a chartered pilot. Plumlee advised that he had flown charter flights between Phoenix, Arizona, and Denver, Colorado, which could have conceivably coincided with Organized Crime murders and fires, most notably, the recent bombing murder of Phoenix investigative reporter Don Bolles. Plumlee stated that this was all the information in which he thought the FBI would possibly be interested.

On July 26, 1976, Plumlee telephoned the Phoenix Division of the FBI and stated that he desired to speak with the FBI concerning matters that he could not discuss over the phone. He stated that he had been in contact with Senator Barry Goldwater's office, a Mr. Lombard, and had been referred to the FBI.
